My dear Father.

I wrote you a hasty letter from Raleigh on yesterday morning enclosing a letter from Mr Stott.

I write you this morning by Luke on his return to Raleigh to report our safe arrival at our lovely Home - We were accompanied by Mr Woodcock who came up to the House just as we were about leaving your lot. Thomas left Raleigh ~~and~~ or two before us and had a dinner prepared by the time of our arrival -

I find but little indisposition in the black families - a boy at Bobbitts sick - & two men with legs cut with by the blades -

The oat crop all saved - a fine crop - Mr Piper speaks favourably of the corn crop - The cotton most unpromising and now perishing with rot.

The enclosed letter I received from Mr Disney yesterday - I suppose Mr Mickel would not like to pay off the bond unless it could be had to be surrendered ~~it~~ at the time of payment. I shall not write to him until I hear from you -

Anne & the little ones all well with the exception of Deucean: he is to suffer a good deal with his teeth - I hope the mail <sup>on</sup> by Friday will bring us a letter informing us of the safe arrival of yourself and dearly loved sisters at the end of your travel - I will write you frequently & fully.
